

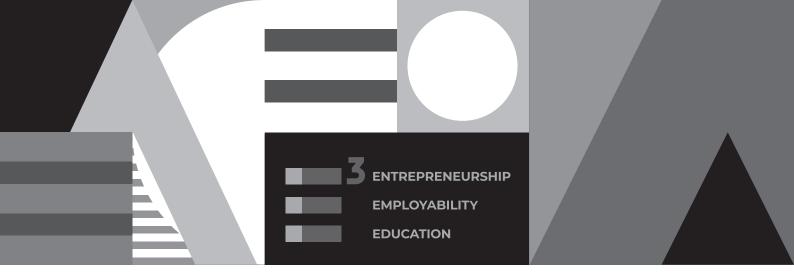



Have a conversation in groups and then share your ideas with the class.





LANGUAGE STRUCTURES AND CONVENTIONS PART OF SPEECH **EXPLANATION** a word (other than a pronoun) used to identify any of a class of people, Noun places, or things (common noun), or to name a particular one of these (proper noun).
